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TODAY'S FOCUS

Jesus calls us from sinful selfishness to selfless service. Repentance in my life models my Savior Jesus Christ. Jesus came not to be served but to serve and to give His life as a Ransom for us.

In 1717, Anne Steele was born at Broughton, Hampshire, England. Her dad was a timber merchant and a lay pastor at a Christian congregation in Broughton. Her mom died when she was 3. After a hip injury at age 19, Anne was an invalid. 3 years later, she was engaged to be married. Sadly her fiancé drowned on the day of the wedding.

After the death of her fiancé she wrote hymns, devotionals and generally helped her dad with some aspects of his ministry. She remained unmarried. Despite her sufferings she maintained a cheerful and God-glorifying attitude. The Lord took her to heaven in 1778 and her body was laid to rest at St Mary Church, Broughton, Test Valley Borough, Hampshire, England and include over 144 hymns. We use one of her hymns to focus our hearts and minds today.

INVOCATION, CONFESSION OF SINS, & ABSOLUTION

- LEADER: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. God invites us to come into His presence and worship Him with humble and penitent hearts. Let us acknowledge our sinfulness and ask Him to forgive us. Oh, most holy and merciful Father:
- All: We confess to You and to one another and before the whole company of heaven that we have sinned by our own fault, in our own thoughts, in our own words, and in our own deeds. We have sinned against You by what we have done, and we have sinned against You by what we have failed to do.
- *LEADER:* We have not always done Your will. We listen to lies in order to justify our actions. Have mercy on us, Lord, and forgive us.
- All : We have not been faithful stewards. We worry. We think You are without knowledge, without power or without compassion. Have mercy on us, Lord, and forgive us.
- *LEADER:* Forgive us for the sake of Your Son's perfect life and innocent death on the cross. You wrote, "Cleanse me, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow."
- All: Create in me a pure heart, O God. Renew an unwavering spirit within me. Restore to me the joy of Your salvation. Sustain me with a willing spirit.
- *LEADER:* God shows His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. As distant as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our rebellious acts from us. Take heart, your sins are forgiven!
- All: Amen! Thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ! Amen and Amen!

LEADER: Almighty God, we confess that we deserve to be punished for our evil deeds. But we ask You graciously to cleanse us from all sin and to comfort us with Your salvation; through Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

Second Lesson:

GENESIS 37:1-11

Ultimately, God brought the prideful low and raised up humble Joseph. In doing so, God both kept His promises and also saved the family of God and countless others.

Jacob lived in the land where his father had resided as an alien, that is, in the land of Canaan. ² This is the account about the development of the family of Jacob: When Joseph was seventeen years old, he was tending the flock with his brothers.

He was just a boy compared to the sons of his father's wives Bilhah and Zilpah. Joseph brought a bad report about them to their father. ³ Now Israel loved Joseph more than all his other sons, because he was the son born in his old age, and he made him a special robe. ⁴ His brothers saw that their father loved him more than all his brothers, so they hated him and could not speak to him in a friendly way.

⁵ Once Joseph had a dream, and he told it to his brothers, so they hated him all the more. ⁶ He said to them, "Please listen to this dream that I have dreamed: ⁷ There we were, binding sheaves in the field, and suddenly my sheaf rose up and stood upright. Then your sheaves gathered around and bowed down to my sheaf." ⁸ His brothers said to him, "So will you really reign over us? Will you really have dominion over us?" They hated him all the more because of his dreams and what he said.

⁹ Then he had another dream and told it to his brothers. He said, "Listen, I had another dream. This is what I saw: The sun and the moon and eleven stars bowed down to me." ¹⁰ He told it to his father and to his brothers.

His father rebuked him and said to him, "What kind of dream is this that you have dreamed? Will I and your mother and your brothers really come and bow down to the ground in front of you?" ¹¹ His brothers were jealous of him, but his father kept what he had said in mind.

THIRD LESSON:

For our motivation and our model, Christ points back to God's plan for the Son of Man. Jesus came not to be served, but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many.

¹⁷ As Jesus was going up to Jerusalem, He took the twelve disciples aside; and on the way He said to them, ¹⁸ "Look, we are going up to Jerusalem. The Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and experts in the law, and they will condemn Him to death. ¹⁹ They will hand Him over to the Gentiles to mock, flog, and crucify Him. On the third day He will be raised."

²⁰ Then the mother of Zebedee's sons came to Him with her sons, kneeling and asking something of Him. ²¹ He said to her, "What do you want?" She said to Him, "Promise that in Your kingdom these two sons of mine may sit, one on Your right hand and one on Your left hand." ²² But Jesus answered, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I am about to drink?" They said to Him, "We are."²³ He said to them, "You will indeed drink My cup, but to sit on My right hand and on My left hand is not for Me to give; rather these places belong to those for whom they have been prepared by My Father."

²⁴ When the ten heard this, they were angry with the two brothers. ²⁵ But Jesus summoned them and said, "You know that the rulers of the nations lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them.

²⁶ It will not be that way among you.

Instead whoever wants to become great among you will be your servant, ²⁷ and whoever wants to be first among you will be your slave— ²⁸ just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a Ransom for many."

FOURTH LESSON:

One of Scripture's greatest chapters begins with one of its sweetest verses: Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.

So then, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. ² For in Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit of life set me free from the law of sin and death. ³ Indeed, what the law was unable to do, because it was weakened by the flesh, God did, when he sent His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh to deal with sin. God condemned sin in His flesh, ⁴ so that the righteous decree of the law would be fully satisfied in us who are not walking according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit.

⁵ To be sure, those who are in harmony with the sinful flesh think about things the way the sinful flesh does, and those in harmony with the Spirit think about things the way the Spirit does. ⁶ Now, the way the sinful flesh thinks results in death, but the way the Spirit thinks results in life and peace. ⁷ For the mind-set of the sinful flesh is hostile to God, since it does not submit to God's law, and in fact, it cannot. ⁸ Those who are in the sinful flesh cannot please God.

⁹ But you are not in the sinful flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed God's Spirit lives in you. And if someone does not have the Spirit of Christ, that person does not belong to Christ. ¹⁰ But if Christ is in you, your body is dead because of sin, but your spirit is alive because of righteousness.

People in this world have many different ways of looking at life. Our days are marked with the unreal, the virtual reality, the pretend. Right to Jesus' face, Governor Pilate mocked such a thing as absolute truth. He



trusted Roman Power. Sadly, many continue such pretend questions like, "What is truth?' They pretend they want to know. But Jesus has always been a plain talker. Pretend religious-types do not care to listen to Jesus who said, **"I AM the Way, the Truth, and the**

Life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." (John 14:6)

The Almighty Living God cannot lie. His Word is without error. For 1500 years the Holy Spirit revealed and preserved God's Word through about 40 writers. Apart from God and His holy Word, there is no other eternally reliable authority. God's Word alone has passed the test of time.

Old ways in science, medicine and even politics are tossed aside in favor of ever-new findings. Ever-changing textbooks must be updated. The cycle continues. A basic tenet of science-inquiry is that nothing is for certain. My sinful nature wants to treat God's Bible like a class text-book,

My culture whines for updates to "out-dated morality;" doubts and fears attack my faith. Jesus took His last suffering breath on the cross for all such sin. Together with the Easter-morning disciples, I catch my breath at Jesus' power and love, never changing, to bless me from above. Wow!

The Two Main Teach- ings of the Bible.	What are the two main teachings (doctrines) of the Bible? The "LAw" is the God-standard of holiness; it always accuses the sinner for failures to live up to God's require- ments and demands justice for rebellion. The "GOSPEL" is the "Good News", God declares the forgiveness of all sins. Christ died for sinners; and all whom the Father draws to believe in Jesus Christ as their Savior will be saved. Based on those doctrines, remain faithful to God's Word, restored through His servant, Dr. Martin Luther. HOLY SCRIPTURE alone is the authority for faith and life. Doctrines and moral positions do not change from decade to decade. God's gift of salvation is ours by FAITH alone; All glory belongs to God, from beginning to end.

Continue. God's gracious Reformation continues in 3 principles: GRACE ALONE, FAITH ALONE and SCRIPTURE ALONE. Dr. Luther was



teaching these Words of God: salvation is God's gift.

Like Martin Luther, I hold to truth that A) the Bible is God's Word; B) God's eternal Son fully completed my salvation; C) God's gift of joyful confidence, faith, was created in me by His Word. And God's gifts are not just for me, but are intended for all who trust His word.

Faith and love continue be-

cause Christians know what is waiting for us in heaven—the hope we have had since we first heard the true message. This is the Good News that was announced by angels to Bethlehem shepherds . Throughout the world, this Good News is bringing blessings and is spreading. And that's what has been happening with you since the first time you heard it and understood the truth about God's grace. 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BIBLE READINGS

Genesis 11:1-9; Luke 16:19-31

Adam and Eve thought the devil's idea about lifting themselves up to God-status was good.

The rebellious people of Babel thought fame and power were more important than obeying God. The rich man put good eating and fine clothes ahead of God.

Do I ever think my popularity or promotions are more important than God? Do I ever avoid what God wants me to do because it might cost me too much time or people might think I am weird? What other ways might keep me from putting God first?

I rejoice that Jesus put His Father's will first and saved me;



that Christ died on the cross for my sake, and not just for me! —for the whole world. All sin was forgiven for Jesus was raised from the dead. I have God's Word on it: Jesus has already worked my salvation for me.

Names identify people and positions. When we use someone's



name, we think of that person's character and reputation. For example, discuss what you know about the character and reputation of the following names: George Washington, Abraham Lincoln, Judas Iscariot, Mary Magdalene, Martin Luther, your parents and grandparents, friends and neighbors.

How I use a name may either harm or honor that reputation. When people curse, lie, swear falsely, or practice witchcraft, they steal God's identity. They replace God with their own sinful ideas to their harm.

Instead God reveals that I honor His Name

by going to Him in prayer. This demonstrates I am based in reality. I find mercy and aid in God alone. I reveal God's true identity to others by sharing the truth: God created everything with His Word; God daily provides for all by the power of His Word; I identify with and support the spread of the Gospel that God gave to all people through Jesus Christ.

On the cross, Jesus shed His blood for each individual sinner. Whoever repents and believes in Jesus Christ will be saved. I have God's reputation on that, so I know I can depend on Him not to fail me.

Have you ever been so angry that you did something you knew was wrong? Jesus said that being angry with someone like that is just as bad as killing them.



It's like the Lord's warning when He tells Cain "sin is crouching at the door." Cain ignored God, obeyed his angry feelings and then killed I his own brother. Our anger with others can lead Us to play God and say, "If I were God, I wouldn't waste my time on him!"

Thankfully, God never said that. In His love, He sent Jesus to be killed for us. So when we see those things about others that make us angry, we are to lift up our eyes and look at Jesus's cross. When we look with the eyes of holy faith,

we see every annoying sin nailed to the cross in Christ. Christ has already killed the sin in that person who is irritating us. He paid for it. The sin done is owned by Jesus Christ. I have no right to it anymore. It belongs to Jesus!

Why kill someone with my anger? Consider the great wonder: my neighbor is a soul for whom Christ already died! I ask God the Holy Spirit to strengthen me look way beyond the irritation and anger. I will focus on Christ crucified for all people, for my sins and yours too.

God's Holy Spirit moves God's children to love, respect, and honor each other the way God intended; to forgive others with the mercy Christ has given us. This is how God lifts His families of faith. Let us pray that we properly keep and bless God's gift of our differences, as God intended.

When I think about it, there are quite a few ways in which people steal even steal from God. The sneakiest thing is the ongoing attempt to steal away God's word from us.

It is very difficult to confess with my heart that I have stolen from others. Have I kept something with the thought to myself, "It's their loss and my gain?" When I was trying to sell something, did I ever lie about it to get more

money? Do I steal by not giving back to God?

In this single commandment, passively letting sin happen (omission) and actively stealing (commission) make each of us a thief. I may not be trusting in God to provide for my needs. (I fail to trust). Or I may not be using the skills and abilities He has given me to work. (I actively disobey). Or both, right?

The commandments reveal God's holiness; our sinfulness. Am I honest ? Do I know I need a Savior who has kept this command for me; One who took the pun-



ishment for me and my thievery? Thanks be to God for sending Jesus.

Christ Jesus took the death-sentence for our sin; Christ Jesus forgives all who believe in Him. Let us now be generous in our giving, our time, our abilities. Or as Jesus Christ said, "Go and sin no more."

When they came for class, the pastor added, "First, go back and collect all of your feathers." The students protested, "Can't do it! It is too windy!" "In the same way, I cannot completely undo what my words have done."

Here God lumps all of us together, for all of us like sheep have gone astray, each one of us has gone our own wicked way. My words go

far beyond where I think they go. People hear the manner, the tone and the words I speak. They begin to draw conclusions. Only the power of the forgiveness of God, written in the ink of Jesus' life-blood, can erase any wicked words I have spoken.

Only God, by the power of His Holy Spirit, can keep my words truthful and helpful. Only God's words can heal the hurts my words have caused.

So I want my words to reflect my Savior Jesus Christ. I pray the Lord God



to guard my lips from evil speech. I pray the He gives me opportunities to speak His holy Gospel.

My sinful desires try to pull the wool over my eyes, to deprive my neighbor of what my neighbor has ("If I can't have it, neither should he!"). My sinful desires scream to be fulfilled, yet my thanks to God are often a wimpy whimper. God has washed me clean of my sin; set me to live a life of holiness in His family. That is my first priority, my target: to live my life as one of His redeemed children.

beautiful woman. But there was an additional complication. This lust object of his was already married! But King David gave into his sinful desires.

David misused his position; he soiled his God-given authority. David had Bathsheba's husband "accidentally" killed. King David set himself up as knowing what

was best for himself. He rebelled against such a fun-limiting God. Bad decisions led to bad consequences for himself, his family and many others.

When I sin against the Tenth Commandment, I am like foolish David, setting myself up in place of, and more important than, the living God. I am saying that God's plan for life is not as good as *my* plan. Actually such arrogant thoughts claim God does not know what He is doing. Yet surprisingly, when I repent of these "thought-sins", God forgives, cleanses, restores me, for Jesus' sake.



May the Holy Spirit of the Lord our God reveal His Word. Keep looking to the Light of God's word. Let us see God's Sacrifice, placed in a manger, nailed to a cross, echoed from the empty Easter tomb: **Christ crucified and risen for me!**

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FAMILY DEVOTION BIBLE READINGS

Exodus 20:1-21



God is not kidding when it comes to keeping His commandments. God demands more than "just doing our best." God rightfully expects perfect obedience from His creation. God hates sin; no rebellion is allowed.

The Bible states, "whoever keeps the whole Law and yet stumbles at just one point is guilty of breaking all of it..." (James 2:10) It's like one link in a chain breaking. The chain is useless, snapped and unable to do its job. Eve and Adam took one tiny bite of crisp fresh forbidden fruit; all creation for all time was hellishly destroyed.

Sin happens. I divorce myself from God. Dirty, ugly, evil, filthy sin makes

me unclean. Sin always separates me from the Holy and Just God. God must punish all sinners, Lawbreakers and Law-benders. That leaves all of us correctly and rightly in a heap of trouble.

PLANNED PRAYER PATTERN FOR WORSHIP LIFE P.A.T.H. - Praise - Apology - Thanks - Help

Praise God, You are holy! **Apology** I am so sorry I fail You. **Thanks** Thank You for Your forgiving grace and mercy in Jesus Christ. **HELP** Use Your Holy Word to fill me with Your Holy Spirit. Increase my joy in keep Your commands. In Jesus, my Savior, I ask. Amen. A flower with five petals represents the rose on Luther's Family Crest. Within each petal is a golden heart (God's love) with symbols of five of the six chief parts of Luther's Small Catechism: 1 The **Ten Commandments**, 2 The **Creed**,

3 Holy Baptism, 4 Holy Communion, 5 The Lord's Prayer, and 6 The Ministry of the Keys and Confession.

Between the petals are blue flowering waters each



marked with a CHI (X) RHO (P) These are the first two Greek letters in the Greek word for Christ. The elongated form of the CHI -RHO symbol suggests 2 different items: 1) a Sword, (the Sword of the Spirit is the Word of God) and 2) a Shepherds Staff.

The 6th chief part, **Ministry of the Keys & Confession** is represented with the arrow-filled, Cross-focused center. Drawn to the **Cross of Christ Jesus** (center) in the waters of **Baptism** (blue arrows), the repentant sinner is gathered in by the Father. The sinner's forgiveness is announced (red for **blood** of Jesus).

The Spirit washed the sinner clean (blue reflecting hope and faith). Then forgiven sinners are sent out. We carry the good news of the Gospel into **all the world** (rich golden arrows circling the design).

"**YES**" is God's answer to every promise in God's Word through Jesus Christ. "**YES**" is created by God when with His Word, the Holy Spirit (red flames) calls people out of darkness into life.
