Build on Solid Rock

Jesus said, "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock" (Matthew 7:24,25).

If you had to evacuate your home because of rising water following severe storms, imagine how difficult it would be to return and assess the damage: muddy floors, moldy walls, and worldly possessions headed for a dumpster. It would be emotionally devastating to observe the physical destruction that the waters caused.

Jesus told a story about building on a location to avoid destruction. He compared a wise builder and a foolish one. The foolish builder built his house on a nice sandy stretch by the water. It was a beautiful place to live until the storm hit.

There was no defense against the rising waters—a complete loss

(maybe even a loss of life!). In contrast, there was a wise builder. He built his house in the hills; he spent the extra time and money to firmly position it on solid rock. It was worth it. The building remained high above the floodwaters and stood strong against the wind.

Jesus' short story speaks volumes for our lives. He wants us to think carefully about the foundation on which we build our lives. It needs to be strong when life's storms strike. When the company is downsized, we want the strength to keep a posi-

tive outlook. When conflict loosens family ties, we want tight knots to hold it together. When we've really messed up, the guilt must not sweep us away. When bad news comes, there needs to be rock-like endurance to get us through.


There's much advice today about successfully

building our lives: build up a network of reliable family and friends, develop more of a positive attitude, get different forms of insurance for rainy days, and pursue proven avenues of achievement. But in the end, they're all "sand foundations." The storms that overwhelm human hearts and hopes are far too violent. We need something stronger to build on.

Jesus tells us to build our lives and futures on the solid rock of his word. It

takes some time and effort to build that way, but Jesus says it's worth it. Hearing of his sacrifice on the cross brings us the lasting peace that we're forgiven. Hearing that Jesus rose and ascended to rule over all things gives us firm hope in the midst of life's uncertainties.

Don't build your life on shifting sand. Build on solid rock. That's Jesus. His teachings give you the strongest foundation for life. Confidently build your life on him. We'd be glad to help you do exactly that!





Parish Nurse Notes

This month we recognize Memorial Day. On that day we honor American's military men and women who lost their lives in service to their country. Additionally, many people take the day to remember non-military loved ones who have died.

Death can be troubling. In the beginning, God did not create things to die. There was no need to say goodbye to loved ones. There was no need for Arlington National Cemetery. No need for funerals. In 1 Corinthians 15:26 death is identified as an enemy. Death leads to grief. You may be dealing with grief, or you may know someone dealing with grief.

Christian Family Solutions (CFS) reminds us that grief is a response to a loss. The response typically includes feelings of deep sorrow and distress. Grief is an individual process. How you grieve will be unique to you. It will be impacted by the significance of the loss, prior history with loss, and cultural, spiritual, and familial factors. There is no right or wrong way to move through the grief process. CFS has a series of helpful articles on "Grace through Grief" (https://christianfamilysolutions.org/helpful-articles/).

Jesus tells us, "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted" (Matthew 5:4 NIV.) God does not want us to be uninformed or to grieve as those without hope (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18.) But it can take time to experience that promised comfort. Maybe the sense of comfort comes in waves. "Sometimes following a loss, people may feel abandoned by or angry with God and question their religious beliefs. Other times people feel more spiritually connected to God following the loss and find hope and purpose through exercising their faith and prayer." (CFS)

Lutheran Family Services has some suggestions for those experiencing grief.

- 1. Discuss your thoughts and feelings with the closest people in your life. There could be a couple of people we trust the most and whom we can be open and honest about everything. Let them know you are not seeking advice, but your desire is to be heard.
- 2. Schedule time to "sit in your grief." Some will do this by visiting the cemetery to feel closer to their loved one. Others may spend time looking at old pictures and reminiscing.
- 3. Attend a grief support group. A local group can be found at https://www.griefshare.org/findagroup.

Maybe you are not the person experiencing grief, but you know someone who is and you want to help. Here are some more suggestions from Lutheran Family Services:

- 1. Be present and available even sitting quietly without conversation can be helpful.
- 2. Acknowledge all their feelings, including those that make you uncomfortable.
- 3. Stay engaged over time, not just during the funeral.
- 4. Be pro-active. Notice the lawn needs to be cut instead of asking if there is anything you can do.

Listen, listen, and listen some more. Refrain from telling your own stories.





THERE'S A REBELLION GOING ON!

Jesus said, "The Spirit of truth will bring glory to Me. He will take what I have to say and tell it to you." John 16:14 This is the revolutionary truth of the Bible: Jesus taught God loves you; forgave you; have mercy on and take care of others, defend the defenseless. This attitude did not sit well with the political machinery of Jesus' day. Mercy was detestable to the Romans. Romans would often abandon their own deformed children, or take them to the garbage dump outside of town. (Christians back then would rescue, restore and raise those abandoned ones as their own.)

The adults were party animals. Their raves and sexual orgies enslaved boys and girls with easy money and fame. They praised perversions and rebellion as "freedom" and "independence" But if any questioned the lies, they were



canceled or killed. "Only the strongest survive." "Life is all about me feeling good." "What's in it for me?!" Pleasure and power and pennies determined how everyone lived.

The teachers in Jesus' day were claiming that God's promised good guy, His holy Messiah, was going to be a political and military hot-shot. Their idea was the Messiah



would kick out the bad guys (Roman Empire) then set up the good guys (Israelites) in a glorious kingdom of peace on earth. God would do this because their religious observances were what God wanted to see? God somehow owed them some peace and power?

After all, the Roman Empire was addicted to perverted sex, to violent blood-lust, to control over others, self-centered living. Violence was so high that only those who were accompanied by their

own paid armed guards would walk the along the narrow streets of Rome at night.

What a dark time and dark culture into which God chose to send His eternal Son, Jesus the Christ. Warped religious teachers of Israel treated Christ and His teachings as a threat. Religious leaders controlled worshipers with rules. Therefore, together with Rome, they judged God's Son as unqualified to live. They killed the Author of life by crucifixion.

But rising from the dead three days later, Jesus sent His followers sent out into this hotbed of hate and treachery. Out from Jerusalem, God's powerful word was proclaimed to cruel Romans, arrogant Greeks and Israel's religious manipulators. God spread His gift of life and salvation by freely and fully proclaiming God's Gospel. They extended His grace and mercy to sinners.

"Speak the truth in love" was Jesus' teaching. "I will be with you always" was Jesus' guarantee. To make it all happen, God's plan included yet another Gift, another Comforter, the Holy Spirit. The Spirit's work is to be with God's people as we walk through life by His side. And that is exactly what the Holy Spirit still does to this day.

The Holy Spirit uses God's Word to create, sustain and grow faith in Jesus Christ, the world's only Savior. But in His Word the Spirit warns us, "Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see if they are from God, for many false prophets have gone out into the world." 1 John 4:1

Jesus spoke truth. When we do good, people will mistreat us, slander and ignore

us. But God says to do good anyway. There is nothing in my own thinking or choosing that leads me to come to Him. Instead as Jesus said, "You did not choose me, but I chose you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last."

God's word says it again and again "... by grace, not

by works, lest any should boast." God does not need a single good work from me; my neighbor does. The lepers of Jesus' day, the repentant thief on the cross, the former Pharisee Saul, Mary and Martha, Peter, Lydia—all rejoiced in God's generous kindnesses freely given to them. The Gospel produced the fruit of joy and thanksgiving in their lives.

Luther echoed the same truth. He wrote "And when anyone thinks outward actions must display his own righteousness and holiness to God and others, this is a double injury to Christ. First because the fruit is forced; secondly, because the trust is misplaced."

Some would come into God's own flock to twist the Word. The false will claim to be true and the wicked will claim to be good. Jesus pictures them like hungry wolves and roaring lions: dangerous and deadly because of what they taught.

Don't leave the protective side of Jesus the Good Shepherd. Apart from Him, we are easy targets for false teachings sweet tempters. God's Word keeps us in His flock, by His side, blessed beyond measure. God's Word is truth.

So let's keep reading our Bibles! Let's stick close to

Christ Jesus, the crucified and risen Savior, God's eternal Son rescued you and me. This same Jesus is returning to take you and me and all believers in Himself home to heaven. He will do this all in His good timing.

This is how the hymnwriter prayed: "Holy Ghost, with light divine shine upon this heart of mine; chase the shades of night away, turn the darkness into day. Let me see my Savior's face,

let me all His beauties trace; show those glorious Truths to me which are only known to Thee."

Your called workers had parents and teachers who would encourage them to "Read the Bible." Now, in our time and culture, continue in the revealed word of God. Find out from God Himself what God revealed in His Word." So, let's keep following His Word.


