Jesus said, "The kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it" (Matthew 13:45,46)

Have you found the perfect Christmas gift for This message is not only perfect; it's one of that special someone yet? If so, what makes it perfect? A pearl in a clamshell! That's often how God works. He comes to us in unlikely places to give us His love. Could that be illustrated any more beautifully than it is at Christmas?

At Christmas, the Son of God, our Savior, was born in a barn!

And then this Jesus willingly gave up his life on the cross to pay for our sins and win us a place in heaven. This Gospel message is God's priceless, perfect Gift for us!





Christmas has us skipping to the Gospel-God's full and free mercies in Jesus Christ! What a gift God has given: freedom from guilt and shame, free to serve Him in grace, without rules.



Seems too good to be true. But 66 books of the Bible all repeat the same glorious announcement: Our gracious God's Gift for you was planned and purchased by Jesus Christ, crucified and risen. It is no wonder Christians love to give a hearty "Merry Christmas!" throughout December, the month we celebrate His birth.

God's gift comes with no strings attached, ready to freely enjoy and use, batteries included as they say. His Word called me to faith. His Word moves me to live. By God's Gift, Christ lives in me. And the life I now live right now I live by faith in Him, the Word-made-flesh, Immanuel. Jesus is the One who loved me and gave Himself for me.

How does God's mercy affect our mouths? Our minds? God urges us to encourage one another. He reminds us to speak and act as those who are going to be standing before

the throne of Jesus one day. The Jesus in the Manger is the One who came to set us free. Galatians 5. Our freedom means God paid off the consequences of our naughty minds and mouths, our rebellious actions. The Bible reveals that there will be judgment without mercy placed on those who do not trust in Jesus for their safety. Christmas reminds us that believers have no need to fear that day we stand before Him. As God says repeatedly in His Word, His mercy triumphs over judgment. 1 John 5.

God's greatest blessing to the world is His Gift, Jesus Christ. Ephesians 3. As we pause in busy-ness, God-willing we will consider the goodness of God to us every minute of every hour, every day, not just year to year. Of what does Christmas remind us? Giving, of course.

It's on every street corner and advert as we scroll our phones, right? Of course, that is what Christmas is all about. But it is not FIRST about and our gifts. It is about God's gifting us His one and only Son. Romans 11. The Lord's generosity prompts the Christian similarly to respond. We have already received life from God who actually is The Life. It is no wonder that we thank God by returning our time, our skills, our resources. And we wrap all of those gifts in His gift-wrap of grace and peace.



Every day is a time to reflect on all that God has given and a time to thank Him, to share His generous gift and care for others. Christ's gracious and faithful care challenges us all. He left the glories of heaven to remove our sin debt. He enables us to do the good He has planned. When those plans all come together, we praise His faithfulness. And the times we fail to do the good we ought to do, we praise Him for faithful mercies as well. Psalm 41

How about we take the time, make the time, to read one of the four Gospels before Christmas day. That way we read about how Jesus went about "doing good." Then we can ask ourselves if we are doing the same. Psalm 9:1. It is not about if others are doing good, it's not about us talking and talking. it

is all about how do I show my thanks back to Jesus for all the good He first did for me



• and then gave to?

Let's keep challenging ourselves to like those first-followers of baby Jesus. He blessed Joseph and Mary with Himself. God's mercies multiplied out to shepherds, then to Magi, then to disciples, then out to the world. His Word continues to bless us today removed from the first Christmas by continents and oceans and centuries. The Word is the power-pack that continues to work. Hebrews 13. Let's continue to learn

about the blessings of God's saving work on our behalf.

As we make use of the Word's joyful confidence in Jesus. Temporary griefs may shade the glory of



His cross for a bit. But as the Gospel shines through, the Holy Spirit heals and strengthens. God does that for those who trust Him, for believers like Abraham, Isaiah, Joseph and Mary, the Magi. Philippians 2:13. Let us continue to carry out whatever God places before us. Let's encourage and lift up others before God's throne of grace. His Word will help them in their time of need.

At this moment, Good Shepherd church and school has a challenge, a need for gifts. To be clear, God does not need our gifts. Our congregation relies on weekly offerings since that is how we carry out our annual ministries. God knows all about our needs and wants in greater detail than

we can imagine. God has also already given His answer.

Our attendance in worship and online shows we are listening. John 8. Let's remain amazed at the wonder of God's Christmas Gift. I am reminded of one group of poor Christians in another country. They couldn't stop talking about Jesus and His family of faith. A visiting missionary told us about their

giving. He had told them he was not trying to order them around against their will. But by bringing in other Christian's enthusiasm as a stimulus to their love, he was hoping to bring the best out of them. In one sermon he said, "You are familiar with the generosity of our Master, Jesus Christ. Rich as He was, He gave it all away for us-in one stroke Christ became poor and we became rich."

Then he noted that they begged his team to let them share in this good that was being done for God's people. This missionary reported that the Lord worked in them in an unexpected, glorious way. He said they gave themselves first to the LORD and then to missionary team before they gave their money. This is what God wants. Such godly attitudes happen when God's family of faith remembers what

sinners deserve and what sinners who trust in Jesus receive. 2 Corinthians 8. God's Gift is truly amazing. Without our knowledge, permission, consent or begging, Jesus stepped into human history. Without even an inviting whisper from our own dead rotting souls, Jesus came at the right time, His time, to save His people from their sins. This time is even called "Christ's Time" or "Christ-mas". Think about that. Malachi 3. How does one begin to say "thank You" to such a generous God for the Gift of His Son?

We all know that if each of our families could give an additional twenty into their offerings for a month, any debt-fears would scatter away like snowflakes in the wind. But some of us don't have even an extra twenty every week. God knows.

We all know that just like the first Christmas, some of us have very little to return to the Lord. God knows. We all know that Jesus only had a borrowed feedbox for His bed and blanket to keep Him warm and safe. God knew that too.

We all know Jesus enabled some to worship Him in person, carrying surprise gifts of worship. What do we all do with what we all know? If we have little, we still have Jesus. 2 Corinthians 9.

So let's come to His manger. Bring a friend or three along with you. Worship the amazing Gift of God, His Son, as often as He enables you to come. The history of Christmas demonstrates how the God who keeps His Word, actually does keep His Word. Jesus is fully aware our challenges in life. Christmas turns each challenge to a God-planned opportunity to let our faith shine even brighter. From my family to you and yours, Merry Christmas!

Parish Nurse Notes

Christmas will be here soon. Don't allow gift buying, baking, and decorating to cause you to ignore your spiritual health. From the Latin word for "coming", Advent is a time of preparation and anticipation for the coming of Christ both in the past in His incarnation as the baby Jesus, but also in the future with His promised second coming as Christ Triumphant. Use Advent as a time of preparation to strengthen your spiritual health. This can be done with the use of an advent wreath, but you do not need to own an advent wreath to prepare for Christmas or strengthen your spiritual health. You can follow the pattern of hope, peace, joy, love, and light.

If you use an advent wreath, *the first candle you light is called the "Prophecy" or "hope"* candle. Use the first week of Advent to read and study some prophecies. **Genesis 3:14-15**, **Isaiah 7:14**, **Isaiah 9:6-7**, **and Isaiah 11:1-10** are prophecies that point to the hope of a Savior. These 4 verses are just a few of the prophecies found in the Bible. Can you find more prophecies that provide hope? Include those in your personal Bible study. Remember this is the hope candle and prophecies provide hope.

During the *second week of Advent, the "Bethlehem" or "peace" candle* is lit if you are using an advent wreath. All of us can focus on the peace gained through the Christmas events that took place in Bethlehem. Read **Micah 5:2** and see that Bethlehem was identified as the place the Savior would be born. Read verses that emphasize peace and reconciliation such as **Isaiah 9:6, Luke 2:14 and John 14:27**. As you study these verses, consider what this peace means in your life.

The *third Advent candle is pink. It is the "Shepherd" or "joy" candle*. Read Luke 2:8-20 to recall the account of the shepherds in the Christmas story. Beyond sharing the shepherds' joy of that first Christmas, we also have joy knowing Jesus is our Good Shepherd. Read and study John 10:11-18. Consider how Jesus is different than a hired man? What does Jesus mean by "I know My sheep" (John 10:14), that He is "known by" (John 10:14) His sheep, that God "the Father knows" (John 10:15) Him, and that He "knows the Father" (John 10:15)?

During the *fourth week of Advent, the "Angel" or "love" candle* is lit. The Angel candle symbolizes our confidence that we will join the angels in heaven on the last day. **Mark 13:26,27** says, "Then you will see the Son of Man coming on clouds with great power and glory. At that time, he will send out his angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the farthest end of the earth to the farthest end of the sky." During the lighting of the Love Candle, passages from the Bible that emphasize love, such as John 3:16-17 or 1 John 4:9-11, may be read. These verses highlight God's love for humanity and the call for believers to love one another.


The *final candle is in the center of the wreath. It is the "Christ" candle*. With five candles burning we now have a lot of light. In **John 1:1-14** we hear Jesus referred to many times as

our "light." Here are some verses from the Psalms to study as you focus on the light of Christ. Psalm 4:6, Psalm18:28, Psalm 27:1, Psalm 56:13, Psalm 89:15, and Psalm 119:105. The discussion of light does not end there. Here are some more verses: Isaiah 2:5, Isaiah 60:19, John 8:12, and John 12:46.

As you prepare for Christmas, maintain your spiritual health. Take time to study God's word. May your Advent season and Christmas be full of hope, peace, joy, love, and light.
