From Christian Life Resources:

Sometimes words are used to obscure reality. Terminating the life of an unborn child is called "abortion." Soon, advocates of abortion rights sold the public on "choice." The mantra was "My Body, My Choice," and you would not know they were advocating for the right to kill an unborn child.

Now even "Choice" is being replaced by the moniker, "Reproductive Freedom."

Early advocates of abortion rights were instructed by marketing professionals that they should not sell the public on the right to have an abortion. But you can sell the public on the right to make a choice.

In a Tower of Babel type of empowerment euphoria, advocates want to convince you that you are not killing a child or even making such a choice. You are simply exercising your reproductive freedom.

None of these talks about what abortion really is – the ending of an unborn child's life.

Scripture calls us to speak the truth (Ephesians 5:15). The fundamental position behind "reproductive freedom" is that some human life is expendable, and, in this case, it is the life of an unborn child. Let's call it what it is so that we can debate the truth and not some obscure euphemisms that seek to hide it.

CHECKING THE LIST TWICE?

There's a fairy tale song that some sang during the past few weeks of December. It threatened children to be good with an implication of *or else*. Time to sweat it out because, after all, Santa checked his naughty



and nice list—twice. And here it is now, the new year. If those Santa tales are true this big smiling elf is already hard at work chalking up my naughties-list.

"Santa-type-gifts" have steel-carbon-fibre strings tightly tied to my behavior. Such gifts are rewards, like a pat on a back by my friend, or an *A* on my report card by my teacher, or a bonus from my boss on my paycheck. One can see how many wrongly think that good behavior can expect a tit-for-tat gift from God. Maybe not a vacation, but maybe He could work it so I could stretch the paycheck to cover some groceries?



And when difficulties and struggles come, do I feel slighted? Ignored? Punished? Like God is pulling up a dump-truck of coal, stocking up early for my next Christmastime. Is that my bummer year starting January 1? My friends, that is *not* the rhythm of God's heart-beat.

Want to know the truth? All the hard work to be good, I mean really good, good from the inside thought to the outside activity, all of the good has already been done. Jesus did it all for us. And Jesus did it right.

Jesus was without sin (holy) all the time, never messed up, never said the wrong thing at the wrong time. He was, and is, holy in every way. I am not. Neither are you. Neither is your

mom & dad, your spouse, your children, your next door neighbor, your boss, your employee, your teacher, your class.... All of our behaviors are a never-ending list that is a mix of very nasty-and-grim naughties.



You get it? That spotlight, the truth, glares into the sin-darkened heart. Here's the icky part. God says only holy souls, those without sin, are allowed to enter His holy heaven, with Him who is praised as thrice-holy by holy angels. Our Father in heaven knows you and me all too well. Holiness fiercely rejects our bad attitudes. Our Holy Creator must destroy all sin and rebellion. So the Father promised to do just that and crush the evil that stains our souls and ruined His perfect creation.

This, by the way, is why deep inside we still get kind of nervous in God's presence. All people, by nature, are doomed to no-fun, despairing eternity because our sins locked us out of heaven. The only thing that gave human the soul-calming peace we crave happened about 2000 years back.

It was a surprising public broadcast in the skies over Bethlehem quadrant, not by drones, but by the Lord's army angels. They could hardly stay in formation as they eagerly spilled out of heaven's gates to give the Lord God glory.



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God designed and delivered the only Way to save souls-Himself. The Lord did this without our input or action, without our consent or approval. The Lord did this just display who He really is: merciful and kind! Advent and Christmas gave us extra times. to review how solid, sure and safe are all souls who trust God's Word. God designed salvation, from Jesus Christ's promised birth, to His betrayal and execution, to His resurrection and ascension. God then declared and finally delivered the Way of salvation.

The Holy Spirit with His Word has convinced *me* that it was for *my* sins Jesus suffered and died, for *my* sins He rose. He wants me to know *my* sins, *my* personal overwhelming deadly sins, are all freely forgiven. No strings attached!

As that sinks in, I have to catch my breath. Because of what Jesus did for me, I get

to be on **God's A-list. Not just on Sundays, but all the time** while I walk through life. And *LIFE* itself is also His gift. God's A-List is *not* a naughty or nice list.

God's A-List stands for "Accepted". Jesus sought me, found me, forgave me, worked it all out for me. He strapped me in, seated right next to Him, and we are headed to His Home in heaven, now my Home also by faith in Him.



I am fully accepted as God's own sheep through what Jesus has done for me. All with no strings attached! Wow! What a great gift! How in the world do I say thank you to what sounds too good to be true? Jesus is my chauffeur through life, on my way to His Father's mansions!

The Holy Spirit uses the Bible to point us to the Son, the Messiah, our Savior. The Father point us to the Lamb's book of life in heaven. There, by faith, our names written and



placed in the throne room of grace of Jesus Christ, God in the flesh. The shepherds heard heaven's joy shouted at them and me. They could not keep the good news to themselves at all.

So I think to myself, how is that echoing in my house *after* Christmas? Do *I* know Jesus is The Virgin-born Babe of Bethlehem? words, am I still awed by the Christ of Christmas as He takes me back Home?


STAY AWED IN CHRIST, THE REAL CHRISTMAS

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Parish Nurse Notes

Happy New Year! Or maybe you are not feeling happy??? This month I would like to talk about wintertime and mental health. When I tried to Google "winter and mental health", most of the articles focused on seasonal affective disorder (SAD.) I will share some of the suggestions that might help boost your mental health this winter season. But first I will start with some promises and suggestions from the Bible that are useful throughout the year.

- To avoid feeling alone and isolated, read Isaiah 41:10. "I AM with you, so do not be afraid. I AM your God, so do not be upset. I will make you strong and I will help you. My powerful right hand will keep you safe." (EASY)
- To avoid feeling anxious, read 1 Peter 5:7. "**Cast all your anxiety on Him**, because He cares for you." (EHV) Or read Philippians 4:6. "**Do not worry about anything**. But pray and ask God for everything you need. And when you pray, always give thanks." (ICB)

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If you are grieving, read Psalm 34:18. "The Lord is **close to the brokenhearted**. He saves those whose spirits have been crushed." (EHV)

- Maybe you are not feeling alone, anxious, or full of grief. But you may be prone to SAD and the depression associated with it. Seasonal Affective Disorder is a form of depression which typically occurs during the fall and winter months due to a decrease in social interaction, lower levels of sunlight, and increased levels of melatonin. Here are some general suggestions for maintaining your mental health during the winter months. They are useful when dealing with SAD.
 - **Stay active** and engage in regular exercise. When possible, exercise outdoors close to midday. Some days your activity might need to take place indoors. That is okay, just stay active. Set a goal that works for you, even if that goal is 10 minutes of daily dancing.
 - **Connect with others**, whether in person or virtually. Social connectedness positively impacts physical and mental health. Reach out to someone every day.
 - **Engage in self-care**, this may include getting adequate sleep, eating healthily, and drinking enough water. Yes, even in winter you need water just think of the dry air in heated homes.
 - Daily take time to meditate on God and His word instead of focusing on worldly distractions. Check out Philippians 4:8 for things to focus your mind on. Check out our new women's Bible Study group *"Rejoice in the Lord"* beginning January 16th. We meet here at Good Shepherd on Thursdays at 2pm.
 - Get outside. Improve your mood with fresh air and sunshine. Bundle up and get outside every day. Consider activities that make it fun to get outdoors sledding, stargazing, or hiking in a local park.

Do something for someone else. When you are feeling down, acts of service can be uplift-



ing. Consider checking in on a neighbor, or performing an act of random kindness. Maybe check out volunteering for a cause like Dime and Dollar Thrift Store in Wisconsin Rapids. Volunteers there enjoy each other's company. They help support our community and the Gospel ministries of

our area WELS congregations. Talk with Cindy Loechler 608-219-9457 for ways to help.

- **Try something new**. When you've been in the same routine for a longer stretch of time, your brain benefits from doing something out of the ordinary. You could join the technology team here at church. Or you could check out a community "Strong-bodies" class, It's held on Tuesdays & Thursdays at 9:00am at Nekoosa Area Community Center. Talk with Bobbette at 715-323-8070 for more information.
- Get enough light during the day. If you can't get outside, hang out in sunny rooms. If your living or working space is dark, consider getting a light therapy lamp.
- Get enough Vitamin D3. In northern climates, like Wisconsin, the sun's rays are not strong enough to give us the vitamin D we need. Talk with your health care provider about supplements. The daily recommendation in the U.S. is 1,000 international units. Mushrooms and fish are also a natural source of vitamin D.

I hope these suggestions help you this winter.
